Given the current covid-19 situation, please note that the FEI's approval of a Schedule should not be taken as an absolute guarantee that the Event will definitely go ahead. The decision whether the Event can take place must be made by the OC and NF in close consultation with the applicable domestic government and public health authorities. It is the responsibility of each Participant to check the status of the Event prior to planning his/her travel to the Event.

Risk assessment for COVID-19

The questions below will enable OCs to review the additional considerations specific to sports, and thus inform their risk assessment of COVID-19 associated with their Event. This will help OCs understand and manage any additional risk from COVID-19.

The risk assessment should be reviewed and reassessed regularly during the planning phase and updated immediately prior to the transition to the operational phase, especially in light of the rapidly evolving nature of the outbreak. Reference should be made to the latest technical guidance and situation reports on the WHO website.

The risk assessment for COVID-19 associated with the Event must be coordinated and integrated with the host country's national risk assessment for COVID-19. The person completing the questionnaire should include input from the local public health authorities, consult WHO's latest technical guidance and ensure that there is an up-to-date evaluation of the epidemiological situation.

Mitigation checklist for COVID-19

Mitigation measures assess the current effort and planning to reduce the risk of spread of COVID-19 disease for the event. As mitigation measures can reduce the overall risk of the sporting event contributing to the spread of COVID-19, they should be taken into account after the risk assessment has occurred to gain a clearer understanding of the overall risk of transmission and further spread of COVID-19, should the event be held. Together with the risk assessment score, the mitigation measure will contribute to the decision matrix and influence the assessment of the overall risk of transmission and further spread of COVID-19 in relation to the event.

General measures to minimize exposure to Covid-19 during the event “Saumur Complet” from 28th April to 2nd May 2021.

These measures are enforced during the event organized at Saumur from April 28th to May 2nd 2021. These measures have been established on March 31st, 2021 and may be updated according to government recommendations. The event is exclusively taking place outdoor. The wearing face masks is compulsory. The event is not open to public, it will be conducted behind closed doors. The following annexes deal with gathering during meals, the welcoming of volunteers, competitors and kin; and volunteers' briefings.

Annex 1: Welcoming of volunteers

Volunteers will be welcomed in the space named « Accueil des bénévoles ». Outside, people must wear face masks and as soon as possible put 1m of physical. All volunteers will receive face masks on arrival. We will offer one reusable masks at all volunteers at their arrival. Arrival: An “Entry Register” must be full by everyone who wants to come in. There will be temperature checking on volunteer's arrival. An information mail about prevention practices will be sent before the event. The information will be also given on site at all volunteers during the briefing. In the volunteer's space, posters about prevention practices and governmental recommendations will be hung on walls. Catering: We planish 2 solutions: Take-away meals OR (if possible, according to the sanitary condition's evolution) meals at the catering according to pre-established times. The wearing of face masks is compulsory during services. Volunteers are asked to respect a physical distancing of 1m when they come inside and sit down. The indicated way of circulation must be respected.

Accommodation: The OC is not in charge of volunteers' accommodation during the event.

Sanitary facilities: clean 2 times per day with certified products.

Use the hand sanitizers placed all around the showground and wash your hands regularly.

Violation of rules:

Anyone who does not comply with the sanitary measures will be asked to leave the site.

Annex 2: Welcoming of riders and grooms, kin.

Do not forget that you must be able to justify your professional or « high level athlete » status.

Before April 19th, 2021, each rider must register him/herself and the accompanying persons before the arrival and sent the “attendance form” (join to this document) AND “high level athlete” status certificate to: comite@saumur.org. **No entry on the site will be accepted without the return of this “attendance form”.**

1 horse = 1 rider, 1 groom, 2 owners

1 rider = 1 companion

At your arrival, only one person can come to the show office with the horse passport to obtain the envelope containing your competition numbers, accreditation and a written Protocol that must be followed during your stay with us. Please ensure that you read the Protocol carefully.

Upon arrival the wristbands for all accredited persons will be handed out and must be always worn and shown on request.

The wearing of face masks is compulsory.

Arrival: An “Entry Register” must be completed by everyone who wants to come in. On their first arrival, a temperature checking will be done on all persons entering the site (riders, grooms, and kin). An information meeting will be held to remind people of prevention practices at the beginning of the event.

Riders, or people under their responsibility must strictly use personal equipment.

Training areas: Access to training areas will be limited to respect the minimum physical distancing required on competition days. One person, wearing a mask, can come with the rider on the warm-up arena.

Competitors must respect the circulation way posted and the allocated stables.

Sanitary facilities: clean 2 times per day with certified products.

Use the hand sanitizers placed all around the showground and wash your hands regularly.

Meals: each rider and their team must assume their own meals. An on-site catering is planned.

Return: For foreigners, medical services will provide PCR-test and execute it in a committed place on Friday afternoon April 30th, 2021. Additional fees (60€) are required per person. They must complete the “attendance form” to notify the OC if they wish one or not.

Violation of rules: Anyone who does not comply with the sanitary measures will be asked to leave the site and / or forbidden from competing. Any excluded person cannot ask for reimbursement.

Annex 3: Federations

Federations can give accreditation to 5 persons maximum. These persons must be registered on the attendance form. Otherwise, the entry on the site can be refused.

Arrival: An “Entry Register” must be completed by everyone who wants to come in. On their first arrival, a temperature checking will be done on all persons entering the site. An information meeting will be held to remind people of prevention practices at the beginning of the event.

Training areas: Access to training areas will be limited to respect the minimum physical distancing required on competition days. One person, wearing a mask, can come with riders on the warm-up arena.

Everyone must respect the circulation way posted and the allocated stables.

Sanitary facilities: clean 2 times per day with certified products.

Use the hand sanitizers placed all around the showground and wash your hands regularly.

Meals: each accredited person must assume their own meals. An on-site catering is planned.

Return: Medical services will provide PCR-test and execute it in a committed place on Friday afternoon April 30th, 2021. Additional fees (60€) are required per person. They must complete the “attendance form” to notify the OC if they wish one or not.

Violation of rules: Anyone who does not comply with the sanitary measures will be asked to leave the site and / or forbidden from competing. Any excluded person cannot ask for reimbursement.

Annex 4: Treatment of Covid-19 case(s)

For any case(s) declared the OC Comité Equestre must be immediately informed. A crisis Covid-19 group is present on site, in close liaison with ARS, during the whole event.

Symptomatic cases:

- immediate return to competitor's lorry, or if not possible isolation in the isolation cell on site for the purpose. She/he would be taken in charge by our Medical services.

Declared cases:

- as soon as the team or the person has confirmation of the case, the OC Comité Equestre must be informed.
- inform people who might have been in contact.
- a return on site after written medical prescription by treating doctor.
- cleansing of the isolation cell.

RESPONSABILITY:

The spread of the virus depends on the individual's responsibility and the attention paid to complying with all measures. Similarly, it will be up to everyone not to join the competition if they think they have symptoms of Covid.

Also, in the weeks following the competition, urgently notify the organization if you were positive for Covid and likely to have been in contact with others during the disease incubation period.

Do not forget, all these measures will allow the safety of all and the continuation of professional equestrian competitions.

Thank you all for your involvement and for the respect of these indispensable rules. In this context, we invite you to keep the friendly spirit of the events and specially to highlight the most important, the sporting spirit!

We look forward to welcoming you and good competition to all!

Mesures générales pour limiter l'impact du Covid-19 pendant l'évènement du « Saumur Complet » du 28 avril au 2 mai 2021

Ces mesures sont appliquées pendant l'évènement organisé à Saumur, du 28 avril au 2 mai 2021.

Ces mesures ont été établies le 31 mars 2021 et peuvent être amenées à changer en fonction des recommandations gouvernementales. L'évènement se déroule uniquement à l'extérieur. Le port du masque est obligatoire. L'évènement sera fermé au public, et se déroulera à huis clos. Les annexes suivantes concernent les temps de repas, l'accueil des bénévoles, compétiteurs et leur entourage et le briefing des bénévoles.

Annexe 1 : Accueil bénévoles

Les bénévoles seront reçus sur l'espace « Accueil bénévoles ». A l'extérieur, les personnes doivent obligatoirement porter le masque et mettre dès que possible, 1 mètre de distance physique. A leur arrivée, les bénévoles reçoivent un masque. Le Comité offre un masque réutilisable à chaque volontaire à leur arrivée.

Arrivée : Un registre d'entrée devra être complété par chaque personne voulant pénétrer sur le site. Il y aura une vérification de la température des bénévoles dès leur arrivée. Le comité enverra, en amont, des informations relatives aux mesures sanitaires mises en place sur l'évènement. Ces informations seront rappelées lors du briefing des bénévoles. Des posters sur les gestes barrières, et les bonnes conduites seront affichés sur les murs.

Restauration : Nous prévoyons 2 solutions : des repas à emporter OU (Si les conditions sanitaires nous le permettent) des repas en cafétéria suivant des horaires préétablis. Le port du masque est obligatoire durant le service. Il est demandé à tous les bénévoles de respecter 1 mètre de distance entre eux, et de s'asseoir. Le sens de circulation doit être respecté.

Logement : Le comité n'est pas responsable du logement de ses bénévoles.

Sanitaires : ils seront nettoyés deux fois par jour avec des produits certifiés. Du gel hydroalcoolique sera à disposition sur différents emplacements de l'évènement, et il est demandé de se laver les mains régulièrement.

Violation des règles : Quiconque ne respecterait pas les règles sanitaires, sera exclu du site.

Annexe 2 : Accueil des cavaliers, grooms et entourage

N'oubliez pas que les cavaliers doivent absolument fournir un justificatif « d'athlète de haut-niveau ».

Avant le 19 avril 2021, chaque cavalier doit s'inscrire, ainsi que les personnes l'accompagnant, avant leur arrivée sur le site, et doit remplir et retourner le formulaire d'entrée (ci-joint) ET le justificatif « Athlète haut-niveau » à l'adresse mail : comite@saumur.org. Aucune entrée sur le site ne sera acceptée sans un retour de ce formulaire complété.

A votre arrivée, seulement une seule personne devra se présenter au secrétariat général avec le passeport du cheval pour obtenir l'enveloppe contenant les numéros de compétition, les accréditations et le protocole sanitaire qui devra être suivi durant le séjour de l'équipe. Merci de lire attentivement ce dernier.

A votre arrivée, des bracelets d'accréditation seront distribués selon votre statut, qui seront à porter toute la durée du séjour et à présenter à chaque fois qu'il vous le sera demandé. Le port du masque est obligatoire sur tout le site.

Arrivée : Un registre d'entrée devra être complété par chaque personne voulant pénétrer sur le site. A leur première arrivée, une prise de température sera effectuée à l'entrée du site. Au début de l'évènement, une réunion sera tenue pour rappeler les règles sanitaires à respecter. Les cavaliers, et leur équipe sont tenus d'utiliser uniquement leur propre matériel.



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III. THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

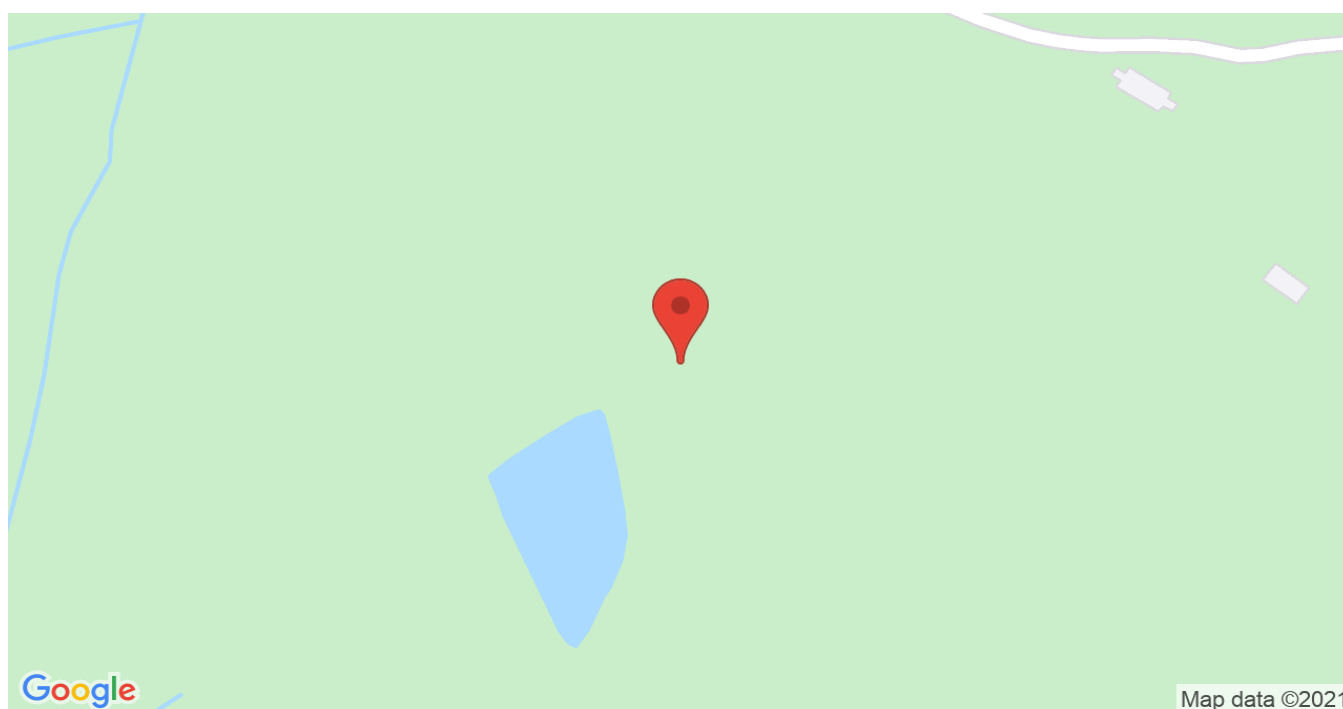

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter IX: For all Pony Events, Ponies must be available for Pony Measurement if requested by the FEI.

5. INJURY SURVEILLANCE

FEI Veterinary Regulations Chapter VIII: Horses participating in FEI Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; and in the event of fatality, a post mortem examination.

6. TRANSPORT OF HORSES

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in suitable vehicles for the transport of horses. Any government requirements for disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, to ensure that the horse is in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the Event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have the responsibility to comply with national legislation in both their country of origin and the host nation of the Event. Where necessary athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation. Within the European Union (EU), this includes EU Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 concerning the protection of animals during transport within the Member States of the EU.

7. VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION & FITNESS TO COMPETE

7.1 PASSPORTS (FEI GENERAL REGULATIONS ARTICLE 137)

For all issues relating to FEI Horse Passports/FEI Recognition Cards please contact your National Federation. All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI. FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events. NB: Horses entered in CIMs and in CSIP in their country of residence are not required to have an FEI Passport or FEI Recognition Card but must be properly registered with the FEI and identifiable (GRs 137.2). Athletes who do not present a Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card, or one that is not correctly validated or fail to meet other passport requirements will be subject to Sanctions in accordance with Annex VI of the FEI Veterinary Regulations and may not be allowed to compete. NB: for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union: all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

7.2 VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLE 1003)

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below.

All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these VRs. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine

Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory.

7.3 EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLE 1031)

On arrival at an Event venue, all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip ID (where present), their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status concerning vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

7.4 HORSE INSPECTIONS (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLES 1034-1042)

All Horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not be permitted to compete.

7.5 LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLE 1048-1053)

All Horses are subject to examination under the protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the period of an Event, including, but not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event. Horses may be selected for examination under the protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the examination or are subject to immediate disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

8. EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCMP)

8.1 SAMPLING (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS CHAPTER VII)

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of Prohibited Substances in accordance with the Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures. Refer to FEI Financial Charges for details of fees relating to Equine and Human Anti-Doping program (EADCMP), which OCs/NFs have the right to charge to the athlete (applicable for all FEI events worldwide).

8.2 ELECTIVE TESTING (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLES 1057 AND 1058)

XIII. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

ASSUMPTION OF RISK / WAIVER OF LIABILITY

In consideration of being allowed to participate in the Event and related activities, all Participants (as defined in the Policy) acknowledge, appreciate, and agree that:

1. Participation includes possible exposure to and illness from infectious diseases including but not limited to COVID-19. While particular rules and personal discipline may reduce this risk, the risk of serious illness and death does exist; and,
2. The Participants knowingly and freely assume all such risks, both known and unknown, even if arising from the negligence of the OC or others, and assume full responsibility for their participation; and,
3. The Participants willingly agree to comply with the stated and customary terms and conditions for participation as regards protection against infectious diseases. If, however, a Participant observes any unusual or significant hazard during his/her presence or participation, the Participant will remove himself/herself from participation and bring such to the attention of the nearest official immediately; and,
4. The Participants, for themselves and on behalf of their heirs, assigns, personal representatives and next of kin, HEREBY RELEASE AND HOLD HARMLESS THE OC AND THE FEI, their officers, officials, agents, and/or employees, other participants, sponsoring agencies, sponsors, advertisers, and if applicable, owners and lessors of premises used to conduct the event ("RELEASEES"), WITH RESPECT TO ANY AND ALL ILLNESS, DISABILITY, DEATH, or loss or damage to person or property, WHETHER ARISING FROM THE NEGLIGENCE OF RELEASEES OR OTHERWISE, to the fullest extent permitted by law.

The Participants confirm to have read this release of liability and assumption of risk agreement, fully understand its terms, understand that they have given up substantial rights.

2. MEDICAL INFORMATION FORM FOR ARMBANDS

Declaration of medical condition

Athletes with medical conditions that may be relevant in the case of a medical emergency are responsible, at every Event when riding, for wearing a medical data carrier* from a system provider able to communicate information at least in English. Alternatively (and at the minimum) a medical armband of good quality can be used. Athletes who chose to wear an armband should download and fill the form available for this purpose on the FEI's website <http://inside.fei.org/fei/your-role/officials/eventing/forms>.

** Medical data carrier (also called "medical identification tag"): small emblem or tag worn on a bracelet, neck chain, or on the clothing, intended to alert paramedics/physicians/ first responders that the wearer has an important medical condition.*

Conditions that are relevant include recent head injury, serious past injuries/surgery, chronic health problems such as diabetes, long-term medications and allergies. If in doubt, the athlete should discuss this with his own treating physician."

3. INSURANCES AND NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risks. To the greatest extent permitted by law, the FEI and the FEI Event Organiser shall NOT be liable for any damages relating to loss of property or injury of any kind to Athletes, Owners, Support Personnel or Horses at or in connection with an FEI Event and the FEI expressly excludes all such liability.

3.1 ATHLETES, OWNERS AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL

3.1.1 Personal accident and health insurance

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/ Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at FEI Events and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at a FEI Event.

You should check with your National Federation to confirm if your National Federation's insurance policy (if any) covers personal accidents and/or illnesses, which may occur when you are attending at/participating in FEI Events.

If your National Federation does not have a personal accident/health insurance policy or if the National Federation's insurance policy does not cover personal accident or health claims, then you should obtain your own personal accident and health insurance policy to cover your attendance/participation at FEI Events.

XV. ANNEXES

1. STEWARDING

If an athlete is uncertain as to whether the boots he/she intends to use during an event are allowed, he/she or his/her representative should show the boots to the Chief Steward for his/her opinion before the boots are used in training or in competition.

In addition, athletes are to be made aware that hind boots must be removed and placed again on the horse's legs in the presence of a Steward while in the warm-up arena prior to entering the competition arena for certain competitions. (If bandages are used in place of boots, athletes are not required to remove the bandages in the warm-up arena.) This procedure is compulsory for competitions for which boot and bandage control is mandatory, that is the Nations Cup, Championships, and the competition with the highest prize money, and is at the discretion of the Chief Steward for other competitions.

As an alternative to carrying out this procedure at the time designated by the Steward an athlete may ask his/her groom to take the boots to the in-gate and place them on the horse's legs in front of the Steward prior to the combination entering the arena.

The Steward has the authority to intervene if a boot is deemed excessively tight by instructing that the boot be removed and put on again correctly. [Stewards are to note that it is normal for a horse's gait to be somewhat affected immediately after boots have been removed and re-placed.] If an athlete or his/her groom refuses to remove and re-place the boot(s) when instructed to do so by the Steward, a Yellow Warning Card will be issued to the athlete in question.

If it is deemed impossible or unsafe to remove the hind boots in the warm-up arena prior to the combination entering the competition arena, due to an extremely excited or nervous horse, the boots of the horse in question are to be removed by the athlete/groom following the athlete's round upon leaving the arena and inspected by the Steward. This inspection may be carried out during the boot and bandage control if the boot and bandage control is carried out for the competition in question.

This procedure does not replace boot and bandage control after completion of an athlete's round for competitions for which boot and bandage control is mandatory (refer to JRs Art. 244.1)
